As part of Road Safety Week, pupils from St. Vincent's Visually impared school in Liverpool led the way down Mathews Street to raise awareness for The Brake Charity.


Dressed as The Fab Fourhundreds and Thousands road safety mascots the staff and pupils entered the Cavern Club.
