Pupil Premium was introduced to bridge the attainment gap for:

- pupils registered as eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) from Reception to Year 11
- 'Looked After Children' (children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months) from Year 1 to Year 11.
- children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces. This service premium is designed to address the emotional and social well-being of these pupils.

Pupil Premium is additional to our main school funding.

Objectives

1. The additional funding will be used to address any underlying inequalities between children eligible for Pupil Premium and others.
2. We will ensure that the additional funding reaches the pupils who need it most.
3. The Pupil Premium will be used to provide additional support to raise the standard of achievement for these pupils.

Strategies

1. Pupil Premium will be clearly identifiable within the budget.
2. The Principal, in consultation with the governors and staff, will decide how the Pupil Premium is spent for the benefit of entitled pupils.
3. The school will assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils.
4. The school will be accountable for how it has used the additional funding to support the achievement of those pupils covered by the Pupil Premium

5. The school will publish information about how we have used the Pupil Premium on the school website.
6. The school will ensure that parents and LA are made fully aware of the attainment of all pupils including those covered by the Premium.
7. The school will seek to further develop strategies and interventions that can improve the progress and attainment of pupils covered by the Premium.
