

Lesson: Journey of Peace Comics RE lesson 3.	Comic: Comics 5, 6, 7.
Overview of Key Skills Literacy Discussion and evaluation	Cross-curricular links English, Citizenships, PSHE.
Learning Objectives:	For pupils to read, discuss and note the meanings and teachings of 3 Bible passages:- <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. St. Paul to the Galatians 5:19-24 2. Matthew 22:36-40 3. Matthew 5:1-12 For pupils to note parallel teachings in the respective 3 Comics 5,6 and 7.
Key Teaching Points / Research Opportunities	Pupils to read Comic 5 (All together now statue and the revealing of the 'good' and 'bad' side of each of the St. Vincent's characters.) Pupils to then read St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians 5:19-24 and note the parallel moral teachings. Pupils to read Comic 6 (Dr. Noël Chevasse) and then note what Jesus said were the 2 most important commandments (use of prior learning). Pupils to reflect on fact Noël Chevasse died at the age of 33- same age as Christ was- it is commonly believed- when he died. Pupils again to note parallel moral teachings in comic and in Jesus' words. Pupils to read Comic 7 (Robert Peel and the power of the 'good' keys, with their positive properties of health, happiness, wisdom, peace, friendship, bravery and justice, to protect us. Pupils to then read the Beatitudes focusing on 'Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for what is right they shall be satisfied'. Again pupils note parallel values.
Independent Work	Reading and writing.
Plenary	Pupils to listen to 'All together now' by The Farm (Liverpool band). Pupils to reflect on the Journey of Peace and be invited to pray using the Beatitudes as a stimulus.
Resources, including ICT	From the Old Testament : Book of Job, (life is not perfect- it can be a test) character of King David.(people are not perfect but they can change).

Assessment Opportunities	<p>Teacher observation of pupils engagement ; quality of discussion and links being made between comic stories and bible readings ; quality and accuracy of written work.</p>
